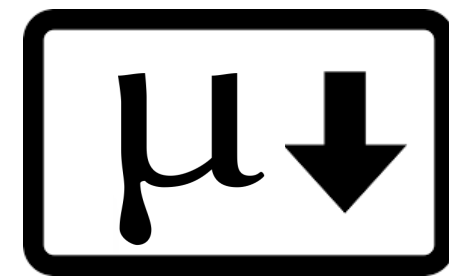
6 Rule kinds

- Typography
- Vocabulary
- Code display
- Infrastructure
- Semantics
- Evolution

Overview of rules

Rule name	Kind	Description
ENGLISH TYPOGRAPHY	typography	Check that punctuation follows English typography: in English, there is no space before diacritics (;?!), and there is space after diacritics and (.,). I pay attention that a diacritic can be the last character of a line: in this case, I do not report errors.
FRENCH TYPOGRAPHY	typography	Check that punctuation follows French typography: in French, there is a space before diacritics (;?!), and there is space after diacritics and (.,).
NOTTHEFIGUREX	typography	Check that references to figures, sections, and tables are correctly capitalized before an anchor and that there is no 'the' before.
HEADER CAPITALIZATION	typography	Check that headers follow a consistent capitalization strategy (uppercase or lowercase, including stopword handling).
LAST PERIOD IN CAPTION	typography	Check that caption in figure, math equation or code block either ends with a terminating period or not, depending on my configuration.
LAST PERIOD IN LABELS	typography	Check that paragraph labels consistently ends with a period.
EMPTY CAPTION	typography	I verify that captions are not left empty.
VOCABULARY	vocabulary	I check that certain vocabulary is not used. I'm configured with a list of pairs showing the vocabulary that should not be used and the correct one.
METHOD REFERENCE	code	Check that method references are consistent within a document.
METHOD STRUCTURE	code	Check that methods in code blocks have an empty line after the selector when there is no comment.
CODE INDENTATION	code	Check that code blocks use tabs for indentation instead of spaces.
CODE LAST PERIOD	code	Check that a code block either ends with a terminating period or not.
REFERENCE CHECKS	infrastructure	Check duplicated anchor definitions, missing references
NO SPACE IN FILENAME	infrastructure	Identify files with space in their names.
CODE EXPRESSION TEST	semantics	Check that code block 'evaluation' is correct.
DESYNCHRONIZED CODE	evolution	Verify that synchronizable code blocks are in sync with the system version.
